First, For payment of all my just and lawful debts sickness and funeral charges secondly, I appoint my Executors as soon as convenient after my death to pay the sum of two hundred pounds Sterling to each of my three daughters Gordon Irvine Dick or Donald, relict of Christopher Gordon Donald, Martha Dick or McElligott spouse of William McElligott, and Sarah Dick or Macdonald, spouse of George Stewart Macdonald, and failing my said Daughters or any of them leaving children, the said sum shall be divided among such children in equal proportions; But the said sums shall be payable to my Daughters or their Children under deduction always of the funeral only of any sum or sums of money which may have been advanced by me or my late husband to them or their husbands, and be due and owing by them at the time of my death.
