The conditions under which the 1st Battalion The Border Regiment were called upon to go into action EAST of MONCHY LE TREUX in the evening of May 19/1917 were briefly these. After the 29th Division had fought hard to a standstill on the night of April 23rd - the date of the first Battle of MONCHY. The remnants of the 87th Brigade in which they finally stopped advancing. From these positions they had been relieved, & this line more or less consolidated. As these positions were however, distinctly bad from the point of view of observation & the enemy's in front were very good, it was pointed out by means of a short advance of these positions could be wrested from the enemy. The position would be greatly improved.

The British line from which the assault was to take place is shown in the attached sketch map. It will be seen that the present no systematic or organised trench system for either defensive or New Year's action, but was merely extensions of the 'digging in' of the ~~existing~~ troops where they were finally held up on 23/4/17. The front line was disappointed, there being no connection at all

This was accordingly reported to Brigade HQ.</p> <p>At dawn both on the 18th and 19th parties of the enemy had been seen going into CIGAR COPSE and the Bois des ABERNES from shell holes between these two woods. One was also reported, and as a result of these two pieces of information the Commanding Officer sent troops (substantially CAPT. A. N. SUTCLIFFE, M.S.) to Brigade Headquarters with a special message to request that the Brigade might be ordered to deal with these two matters, and this was arranged. During the night 18/19th barbed wire was laid in front of our lines, with gaps thereon which the attacking troops crossed. These and the wire were picked up by the wire cutters and carried in parties, carried across to the objectives & buried in front. At the positions being consolidated considerable barbed wire being spun out between the wire cutters completing the wiring. Gumpkin steps were also dug.</p> <p>At dawn of the 19th day then, saw all the preparations, so far as the infantry were concerned, completed, men in position & all required steps taken. The day was perfect, a clear bright cloudless day. Hot and dry with a cool breeze, a breath of wind to assist throughout the day and night. COFFE across 5 units remained to go, the commanding officer spoke to the Regimental major in clear as follows.

Heavy battery spinning 100x shot of W. edge of Bois de ROSEFINES AAA they must capture at once.

21.00 This message had scarcely been sent when the barrage, punctuated by second fall, did them gave the signal for the attack to commence. Naturally a strong breakdown for some time. The gun heard was heard. A Maxim gun, Lewis gun & Sherman machine gun could be heard.

21.50 The Regimental major informed me command my officer by phone that a platoon name had been sent up by the enemy (a VSB signal for barrage) apparently in the vicinity of BOIS DE ROSEFINES.

22.5. The Cook an orderly who had been sent up to the front back at head quarters related that he had arrived at the front line just in time to see the attack start & the men go over. They went over splendidly officers leading the rear parties picked up the wire trench & carried them forward.

With regard to the night of 19th company very little was known. L. DUNN was known to be killed, most of his men casualties. LT PENE was seen leading on his platoon but as they too came under very severe machine gun fire it was feared that he too had been killed. & most of his platoon become casualties. Company had extended to fill up the vacated line as far as possible but the platoon supporting the advance of P. Coy. had been brought out up. Company. CAPT H. PARKER had been wounded, also Lieut DORHAM. They had been under heavy fire while in trenches & came under a barrage on moving over the open to occupy the vacated front line. LT DANIELLI was in charge of the company, that was left of it in the front line & very anxious for offence. Having come under very heavy machine gun fire from DEVILS TRENCH and THE CART on BIT LANE. The attack had been broken up & a few men had gained ARROW TRENCH and were holding out, but general retirement to our original line was ordered. The line which the LDB had vacated had been occupied by another company of LDBs. but these had not got touch with either flank band or succeeding the line, they were ordered to take out about 500 to their right to gain touch with C Coy, BORDERS, & also to their left. Dinsley about 4 AM. Machine was established as strongly as the number of troops would allow, and with two Vickers guns in the front line.

Patrols worked from the time the retirement to our original line was ordered & sketches bearings worked incessantly to clear casualties, with the result that by dawn the majority of our wounded were brought back to our line & throughout the day the evacuation of stretcher cases, though necessarily slow, was continued. It was reported at dawn that at dawn the enemy were seen taking in our wounded who had fallen near this line.

owing to the heavy casualties arrangements were made during the day for us to be relieved


