



We represent Sir Edward Mann Baronet father of the late Charles Julian Mann, Lieutenant in the 20th Hussars, who was killed in action in France on the 3rd October last.

Lieutenant Mann was unmarried and left no Will, his Estate therefore devolves upon his Father as his next of kin. The gross value is about £13,200.

We shall be obliged if you will forward a recommendation to the Commissioners of Inland Revenue that the case falls within the provisions of the Death Duties (Killed in War) Act 1914 for the remission of the proper proportion of Estate Duty.

his general condition is still unsatisfactory, he was unable to submit his blood for examination during last attack of fever, as he was absent on a course. He still complains of headache. The Board considers that it is important that the presence of malarial parasites should be proved microscopically. He has been instructed to report at Lidworth Hospital for this purpose on the next attack.




