

Clear and decisive answers to the questions are to be carefully filled in. Expressions such as "may," "might," "probably," etc. should be avoided.

In answering questions care should be taken to discriminate between disease resulting from military conditions and diseases to which the soldier would have been equally liable in civil life.

A disability is to be regarded as due to climate when it is due to military service abroad in climates where there is a special liability to contract the disease.

In a case where the soldier died from wounds received in action (a) (b) (c) and (d) must be struck out.

In a case where (a) (b) (c) or (d) are inapplicable they should be struck out.

When death is the result of suicide, or fault or negligence on the part of the soldier, a Court of Enquiry must be held and its report forwarded to the Officer in charge of Records, Union Imperial Service Contingents, Pretoria.
