On the other hand, one man said he did get to him after he was hit, I bound him up : I another man, whom I do wor I know, also said he helpedhim whilst conscious Beyond these contradictory items we have been unable to obtain reliable news - It is extremely probable that Captain traton & he shared the same fate together. Jone three months ago or so we
