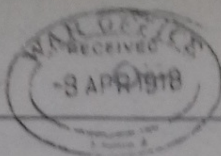

Sir,

Evelyn Melville Shovell Hoare, deceased.
2nd Lieutenant in the Buffs,

Lieut. Hoare was killed in action (or died of wounds received in action) on the 27th March 1918. So far as we know he died intestate, and no Grant of Administration to his estate has so far been obtained, as he left practically no assets. His estate has now become entitled to a share of a Trust Fund on the death of his father, who died some few months ago, and it is therefore necessary for a Grant of Administration to be obtained to Lieut. Hoare's estate. We have been instructed to obtain the Grant, and we should be obliged if you would let us have the usual Certificate of remission of Duties under the Death Duties (Killed in War) Acts.

We should be obliged if you would let us hear from you on the matter as early as possible, as there are urgent reasons for obtaining the Grant without delay.
