Separately, I am sending the War Office the Official receipt for 3 war medals bestowed on my late son Lt.G.F.F. Corbet, Welch Regiment. I beg to point out that on the medals he is described as 2nd.Lt. whereas he was gazetted Lt. on the very day on which he died viz. 23rd Jan.1916.

I also beg to point out that in your acknowledgment dated Sept.18th 1922 of my letter of 7.9.22 you refer only to my second (G.F.F.Corbet) & make no mention of my other son the late R.V.C.Corbet, Lt. 1st Dublin Fusiliers, whom I also mentioned, and I have not yet heard or seen anything of the medals due to him. - I trust they have not gone astray.






By the Act of 6 & 7 William IV., c. 86, sec. 38, it is enacted, "That the Registrar-General shall cause to be made a Seal of the said Register Office, and the Registrar-General shall cause to be sealed or stamped therewith all Certified Copies of Entries given in the said Office; and all Certified Copies of Entries, purporting to be Sealed or Stamped with the Seal of the said Register Office, shall be received as evidence of the Birth, Death, or Marriage to which the same relates, without any further or other proof of such Entry; and no Certified Copy purporting to be given in the said Office shall be of any force or effect which is not Sealed or Stamped as aforesaid."

By sec. 37 of the same Act it is enacted that, "for every general search of the Indexes shall be paid the sum of twenty shillings, and for every particular search the sum of one shilling, and for every Certified Copy the sum of two shillings and sixpence;" exclusive of Inland Revenue Stamp (33 & 34 Vict., c. 97) of one penny.

The Act 24 & 25 Vict., c. 98, sec. 26, enacts that whosoever shall "unlawfully destroy, deface, or injure, or cause or permit to be destroyed, defaced, or injured, any Register of Births, Baptisms, Marriages, Deaths, or Burials, ... or any Certified Copy of any such Register, or any part thereof, or shall forge or fraudulently alter, in any such Register, any Entry relating to any Birth, Baptism, Marriage, Death, or Burial, ... or any Certified Copy of such Register or of any part thereof, ... or shall forge or counterfeit the Seal of or belonging to any Register Office, ... or shall offer, utter, dispose of, or put off any such Register, Entry, Certified Copy, Certificate, or Seal, knowing the same to be false, forged, or altered," shall be guilty of Felony, and be liable to Penal Servitude, or to Imprisonment with Hard Labour.
