Lieut. Gardom was witness' platoon officer. Witness was with the machine gun section and therefore did not himself see what happened but he had it direct from eyewitnesses that Lieut.Gardom was last seen jumping into a Turkish trench. It was impossible to say whether he was killed or captured.

I saw Mr. Gardom jump into the T.T. with three men. Only one of the four returned and he told me that the other two men and Mr. Gardom were killed, Mr. Gardom being shot in the arm and mouth and again just as he was actually jumping into the trench.
