

acknowledge your letter of the 18th July, and in reply
to state that he regrets that you should have
misinterpreted the memorandum which was sent to you on
the 15th July in his name.

Sir Francis Davies desires me to assure you that there was no want of sympathy intended.

War Office receive in the first instance no information other than the initial casualty report as to whether the Officer is killed, wounded or missing, and it is very much regretted that no further details have been received respecting your son. The suggestion that you should write to the Officer Commanding 11th Battalion. Border Regiment, was made in all good faith. It was

known

how heavy the casualties of this Battalion has been in officers, but the chain of Command remains the same, and an officer would have immediately been appointed in place of the Commanding Officer who was killed.

I am further to explain that it is not in the interests of the Campaign that Commanding Officers should be officially asked by the War Office to render information at a time when their whole attention has necessarily to be devoted to the action in progress, and you can readily understand how distracting such official enquiries might become.

on the other hand, for you as a father to make private enquiry by wire or letter is a totally different matter.

I wired you asking particulars of the death of my Son Cap Raymond xl Border Reg beside Albert as your intimation said "he had been killed in action". His body has not been found nor bur ried as we had this information from the Chaplain of the Reg & we cannot get any other information. Now in your last communication you say "if you will write to the Officer commanding you MAY get some information".

I do not know what you think about this sort of thing but I call it absolutely inhuman ,you have emidently have made NO inquiries whatever in the matter ,if so you would know that the C O of this Reg was killed & ALL the officers either killed or wounded & sent to England & yet you coolly say "write to the Commanding Officer & he MAY be able to get you the information".

Please make inquiries at once & let me know as soon as possible.



I am sorry to trouble you again but if you are a Father you will perhaps excuse me .

Your intimation that my Son Cap Raymond Smith of the ) xl Border Reg was killed in action on the lst Inst .

We have been making enquiries & from a L/c Slater whom my sister saw at Etarples (where she is working in a Canteen ) & who said he was with him in the German trench & that a shell came & killed him instantaniously, he told her this twice .

We advertised in the Carlisle papers & had a reply from a Private wh said that he was with him in no mans land & that he was shot & fell ,he undid his tunic Etc & as he did not speak again & was breathing heavily he left him . Now either of these men must be saying what is not correct & what I want to know how do you get your information, that my Son was absolutely killed , the Chaplain says he has not been found nor buried .

Do you take these mens word for it , if so which ?.or have you his identification disk .
