4 am 24 May --	Battalion called out. (Captain S. P. Barlow having assumed command) and proceeded to YPRES following line of railway south of town and thence into trenches in Square I 10. (Sheet 28 1:40,000) from which an attack was made on enemy's trenches about midnight. Battalion was subjected to a withering shell fire in the morning while advancing over open ground.	x.C.
11 pm, 25 May YPRES	Battalion relieved and returned to BRANDHOEK Engls having been relieved by 5 <sup>th</sup> Cavalry Dragoons	x.C.
