Hour, Date, Place	Summary of Events and Information	Remarks and references to Appendices
FLETRE 1 - 2 - 15. OUDERDOM 2 - 2 - 15.	Companies at Ruming Practice - Fire control practice - Bayonet fighting - Brigade headed by the Battalion left FLETRE at 8.28 am to OUDERDOM, distance 13 miles - arriving in new billets at 2.30 p.m. No casualties - 85th Inf. Bde - Reserve Brigade to 28th Division.	
3 - 2 - 15.	Companies at Fire Control Exercises - Bayonet fighting and practising the charge. Cleaning out billets, and making paths. German Aeroplane flew over billets and was fired at, but was flying too high to be hit. This is the first we have seen of enemy at close quarters. Boots issued at WINCHESTER are wearing very badly and causing a great deal of trouble. The same sort of trade or manufacture.	
4 - 2 - 15 Y PRES 9.30 p.m.	[Companies at Fire control & Bayonet fighting exercises] Battalion marched at 6.45 pm. to YPRES to reinforce 83rd Inf. Brigade. It arrived at 9.30 pm. distance about 8 miles, and was held in reserve at 83rd Inf. Bde Headquarters. C & D Coy. were detailed to carry rations and water into the fire trenches. One man wounded, being our first casualty in the war. Battalion returned to billets at 4.30 am. fifth inst.	
OUDERDOM 5. 2 - 15	Battalion arrived in billets at 7.45 am. and rested.	7th inst
YPRES. 6 - 2 - 15.	At 7.15 pm. orders received for Battalion to be ready in time to move at a moments notice to YPRES. Battalion marched to YPRES, leaving at 1.30 pm. arriving at 4.15 pm. C Coy + B Coy, $\frac{1}{2}$ Machine Gun section, drew rations, picks, shovels, prisms, and marched at 6.35 pm. to relieve B & C Coy. 2nd LEINSTER Regiment in trenches. The relief commenced at 8.10 pm. C. Coy and 1 platoon B Coy under Capt. ANSON and 1 LEUT. HEALYS respectively and $\frac{1}{2}$ Machine Gun Section under Lieut T. GURDON, only being required. The relief was carried out and completed by 11.30 pm. without any casualty in spite of heavy rifle fire. B Coy less 1 platoon marched back to billets at 4 am. at KRUISSTRAT, about 2 miles W. of YPRES, the Battalion having left the latter place at 10 pm. and being held in reserve at the former place.	
KRUISSTRAT - YPRES 7 - 2 - 15.	C. Coy and 1 platoon in trenches. Nothing unusual occurred during day till 6 pm. when KRUISSTRAT was intermittently shelled at 5 pm. B Coy (less 1 platoon in trenches) and 2 platoons D Coy marched at 5.10 pm. under Capt. C. S. REEVES to relieve C. Coy + 1 platoon B. Coy in trenches. A. Coy landed at 5.15 pm. to dig 2nd line Trenches under instructions from O.C. / D.C. L.I. Capt. A. T. ROBINSON (2nd in command) accompanied these companies to complete the reliefs, collect reports and the best results personally on his return to 85th Bde HQs. Reliefs were completed at 12 midnight.	
	Casualties during day (skilled & unskilled) during relief.

KRUISTRAT- Y PRES.

8-2-15.

B Coy (less 1 platoon) 2 platoons D Coy in trenches. A. Coy trench digging 2nd line. C. Coy carrying rations and supplies to trenches 3rd Bn. MIDDLESEX Regt. - 2 platoons D. Coy ditto to B. Coy, ½ machine gun section, and 2 platoons D Coy in trenches. Casualties 5 wounded. Situation generally normal. Enemy shelled vicinity intermittently throughout the day. Battalion billets in KRUISTRADT. No damage.

9. 2. 15.

Battalion ordered to relieve 3rd Bn. MIDDLESEX Regiment in trenches S. S. E. YRES. This relief was subsequently counter ordered and the Battalion was employed in carrying rations and water to the trenches. During this 2nd Lieut R. G. MILBURN was wounded. 2nd Lieut W. COKER reported his arrival on joining the Battalion. Lieut J. L. CONGDON was placed on sick list and admitted to hospital. Casualties 4 wounded. Battalion returned to billets by 6.45 am. 10th cont.

10. 2. 15.

Battalion in billets. 2nd Lieut R. G. MILBURN died of wounds at 6 am. Battalion left billets at 6 pm. to relieve 3rd Bn. MIDDLESEX Regiment in trenches which was carried out. Casualties 3. Four wounded. B. Coy (less 1 platoon) 2 platoons D Coy and half Machine gun section relieved in the trenches. Battalion returned to billets and placed at disposal of B.C. 3rd Bn MIDDLESEX Regiment. Casualties

11 - 2 - 15

Battalion on duty in trenches. Nothing unusual occurred. Casualties 5 killed, 15 wounded. German saps observed and reported.

12 - 2 - 15.

Battalion on duty in trenches. Nothing unusual occurred. German saps extended and this was reported. Battalion was relieved by 3rd Bn. MIDDLESEX Regiment. The relief being completed by 1 am. 13-2-15. Casualties killed 3. Wounded four. Missing 2. Battalion after being relieved by 3rd Bn. MIDDLESEX Regiment, Battalion was retained in support of the latter Battalion while special trench digging was being carried out as a countermasure to the German sapping, and left for billets at 4.30 am. arriving at 6 am. Casualties - Nil.

13. 2 - 15.

At 8.30 am. Battalion (less B Coy less 1 platoon, and 2 platoons D. Coy in trenches) marched out with object to attack & capture a lost trench. The attack commenced at 2 pm. A. Coy firing lim and support, C. Coy in support, while 2 platoons D. Coy and 1 platoons B. Coy held in Reserve. The advance was over very exposed open ground and the attack was held up. A. Coy losing nearly all its officers and 1 Coy suffering severely both with many casualties. Casualties officers. 1 killed [Lieut F. J. N. BIRNIE] 1 wounded [Capt A. T. ROBINSON, Capt E. S. G. ANSON, Lieut A. G. HEALES, Lieut G. E. SWINTON, Lieut K. BELL IRVING, 2nd Lieut F. W. COKER, 2nd Lieut D. H. BEATTY.] Rank & file - killed. Eight wounded. 106 missing 37

Battalion marched back to billets at 6 am. 15. 2. 15. Casualties in trenches. Killed Capt C. S. REEVE. Rank & file killed 4 wounded 7 { Lieut C. H. TANG reported missing.
