

I an directed to refer to a letter from this Department dated the 13th April, 1941, and to inform you with regret that no further news has been received of your husband, Pilot Officer John Alfred Parry, since he was reported missing on the 9th April, 1941. Two aircruft took off at 12.45 s.m. on the 9th April, to carry out a reconnaissance of the Horwarian const, and the one in which your husbani was operating failed to return to the base. The second aircraft reported that enemy fighters had been encountered off the Horwegian coast, & search was make by five aircraft and a surface vessel, but no trace could be found of the missing machine or any of its common ta. where I am to add an expression of the Department's sincere sympathy with you in your great enviety, and to assure you that should any further news be received it will be invedigtely communicated to you. Station, Sumburgh, signal A.234 dated 10th April, 1941.

On receipt of instructions from Headquarters, No. 18

Group, to carry out a reconnaissance on the Norwegian Coast, permission was obtained from the Controller for another aircraft permission was obtained from the Controller for another alleratule to accompany the one detailed, to gain experience. Blenheim N.3609 with 84950 Pilot Officer J.A. Parry as pilot was despatched at 12.45 hours, and Blenheim V.5736 with 41708 Flying Officer K. Illingworth (D.F.C.) as pilot at 12.50 hours.

The two aircraft, after completing the reconnaissance, set course for base and were about four miles from Norwegian Coast set course for base and were about four miles from Norwegian Coast when three Me 110s appeared, closing rapidly from astern. Both aircraft took evasive action; Blenheim N.3609 passed the other and disappeared into cloud, Blenheim V.5736 also resorted to cloud cover. When Blenheim V.5736 appeared a few minutes later, there were no aircraft visible, so continued on course to base. At 15.35 hours, approximately 50 miles from base, Blenheim V.5736 heard Blenheim N.3609 calling base. Blenheim V.5736 landed at 16.00 hours. 16.00 hours.

When Blenheim N. 3609 was two hours overdue, five Blenheims were despatched on organised parallel search for approximately 90 miles along track between base and point of leaving Norwegian Coast. Speedboat from Lerwick co-operated. Nothing was sighted.

No reports of any sort were received from this aircraft at base, which on its failure to return was reported missing.
