MESSUAGES, called Hartford Cottages,
situate at Werneth, Oldham; at the juncture of Wellington-
road with Greggs-street, and the Stables, Coach-
houses, Servants' Dwelling, and Outbuildings, thereto
belonging, occupied by Mrs. Duncraft and Mr. Nuttall,
with the Garden and Grounds attached and belonging
