## WILL OF THE LATE MR. S. R. PLATT.

. The will of the late Mr. Samuel Radeliffe Platt, of Werpeth Park, Oldban, who died on September 5, has been lodged at Somerset House after being proved in the Manchester District Registry. The gross value of the personal estate is given as £646,697, and the net es £632.042. The will is dated July 31, 1902, and there is one codicil bearing date August 25, 1902. By the will £1,500 was to be paid to Mrs. Helen May Platt immediately on the decease of the testator, and she was to have £1,500 per annum for life, to be reduced in case of her remarriage to £500, and the jewels, plate, and household effects, wines, &c., in addition to ber marriage settlement. Mr. Platt bequeathed 200 £50 debentures in Mesers. Platt Brothers to bis brother Colonel Houry Platt, and the remainder to be divided among his children in the proportion of two parts to each sou and one to each daughter. These bequests are to remain in trust for the testator's sons until they attain the age of 25, and to his daughters until they attain that age or marry. In case of the death of any son or daughter the legacy is to be divided among the issue (if any) of any marriage he or she may have contracted ..

There are half a dozen bequests (amounting altogether to nearly £5,000), to local charities, including
£2,000 to the Oldham Infirmary, £1,000 each to the
Oldham Bluccoat School and the Hulme Grammar
School, and £200 each to the Oldham Blind Institute,
Oldham Deaf and Dumb School, and Oldham Mission.
By the codicit the testalor bequesths to his widow 350
£50 debcutures in Messis. Platt Brothers in addition to
his other bequests to her. The trustees and executors
are Miss. Helen May Platt, the widow, Colonel Henry
Platt, brother; and Mr. George Spark Claydon, solicitor
to the testalor.
